**Submissions must be received by September 19, 2008**

Winning pieces(s) will be screened publicly and awards presented on October 2, 2008 at the *Governor's Conference on Youth and the Natural World* at the Augusta Civic Center during a lunchtime program.

Winners are selected by a qualified panel of judges based on the guidelines outlined below. Winners will be contacted by phone or email by September 24 and invited to the October 2nd Governor's Conference at the Augusta Civic Center. All entries selected will become part of the Maine Outdoor Youth Movie Festival and available for public showings. ## **GUIDELINES**

Judges will be looking for:

- ✓ Films about children, teens and families experiencing the outdoors

- ✓ Films that describe or demonstrate the value of engaging young people in the outdoors, including personal interviews & testimonials
- ✓ Outdoor activities of all types, particularly those that involve physical activity and are broadly inclusive
- ✓ Films that inspire others to get outdoors
- ✓ Quality content and an original idea. Judges will *consider technique last* and are not interested in spoofs, bloopers, imitations or a high level of special effects.

Will not be accepted:

Films showing:

- ✓ Dangerous, reckless or illegal behavior
- ✓ Use, or depiction of use of drugs or alcohol
- ✓ Profane language

**RULES:**

The entire production must be the work of the person or persons entering the competition. There is no age limit for actors, documentary subjects, or musicians who may appear in the production. Whenever possible, we urge students to use original music, copyright free music, or music they have obtained permission to use. The MOYMF is an educational event and we encourage teachers, artists, and other advisors to work with these young moviemakers. The actual movie production and editorial decisions must be made by the entrant.

PLEASE MAKE SURE DVD SUBMISSIONS WORK. PLAY IT BEFORE MAILING.

**PRIZES:**

Prizes include an Annual Individual or Family Membership with the Appalachian Mountain Club, \$50 gift certificate for L.L.Bean, and an Annual Pass for Maine State Parks.

2. The judges have final say in giving awards and they may expand or delete the number of awards in any given year.
4. The organizers and the cooperating organizations cannot be responsible for loss or damage of your entry.
5. The organizers shall have the right to make and use duplicate DVDs, and digital media of entered movies for publicity and promotion in all formats and distribution outlets including broadcast, cable cast, internet, and future distribution and exhibition formats.
6. The judges decisions are final.
